

And since this is God's church, since we are God's People, that future is a bright one. I am convinced that the best is yet to come.



We know we can't do it alone. We need others. The intentional small groups being formed at St. Paul's are set up to offer support and strengthen our faith. They are designed to help us experience a more palpable connection with God and each other, and thus with ourselves.

Groups will meet for an hour and a half for a total of nine sessions. Beginning late October 2024 through March 2025, we will meet every other week (with a break for the December holidays).

The same group of six to ten people will proceed together from beginning to end, building trust and depth, yielding plentiful fruit within us.

Last year's small group participants spoke of the powerful impact and joy of the support, laughter, and connection; the goodness of feeling heard and understood; hearing and understanding others; and bringing faith and hope to life challenges.

Groups, led by trained facilitators, will gather to check in, share food, read and discuss scripture, and pray. To help determine the days and times groups meet and how groups are composed, please fill out our brief survey by Sunday, October 20. This will also allow groups to reflect shared interests, needs, or life stages.

In this chaotic world, it's easy to lose track of ourselves and of God's loving presence in our hearts. We can feel unmoored.

All are lovingly invited to this vibrant opportunity to sense God with us, as together we feel more grounded, assured, and connected. Blessings!

A New Chapter for St. Paul's Youth Group

The journey of rebuilding our youth group since COVID-19 has been a story of patience, dedication, and hope. It hasn't been easy, but slowly and surely, the seeds we've planted are beginning to grow. This

year, the energy feels different, and we're thrilled to share that we're seeing signs of real momentum!

In the past two years, we've been blessed to welcome five new adults to serve as youth group leaders who work alongside our young people. Each one brings a unique gift, and together, their presence brings all kinds of fun to the gatherings. One evening, youth group leader Jeff Quill shared his lifelong passion for Dungeons and Dragons, a fantasy tabletop role-playing game, and eight teenagers had a blast as they pretended to be mythical orcs, elves, and warlocks on a quest. Fun and unique events like this keep the kids coming back for more and grow the village of support for all our youth.

Last year, we averaged 11 kids at youth group meetings, and this year, the numbers are growing. But what's exciting isn't just the numbers, it's the energy. The kids are showing up with openness and a desire to connect. They are creating a culture of welcome which is growing a sense of community. This is especially evident when we see seventh graders (the first year kids are eligible for youth group) making new friends and happily returning week after week. It's clear the climate of authentic, joyful friendship has become a space where they feel accepted.

We trust that another year's worth of Sundays with shared meals, goofy games, and service to our neighbors will continue to strengthen the program, the group bonds, and most importantly, each teenager that participates. 


